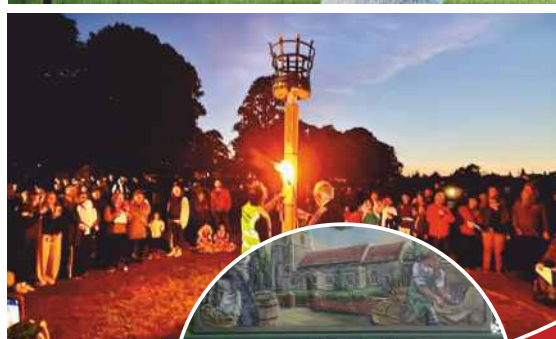

Thoughts from the Rector

Inspired by Pope Francis

The election of a new Pope in recent weeks reminded me of reading the autobiography of Pope Francis, 'Hope', earlier this year.

One of the experiences that Pope Francis wrote about was of a cardinal in America who was approached by two young priests who were asking permission to lead services in Latin rather than English. The cardinal asked whether they knew Latin and the priests replied that they didn't but they were prepared to learn. The cardinal then talked about where they were working and reminded them of the number of Vietnamese migrants in the area. He challenged them to learn Vietnamese in order to welcome the migrants. He also reminded them of the large Hispanic population, all of whom spoke Spanish at home. He encouraged the priests to learn Spanish next, and invited them to come back to him having done that, and then, to talk about Latin. As in that story, it seemed to me that throughout his book, and through his life, Pope Francis was pointing towards welcome, generosity to others, and a care for those in need. As the new Pope settles into his new role, Pope Francis offers both him and the rest of us an example to follow.

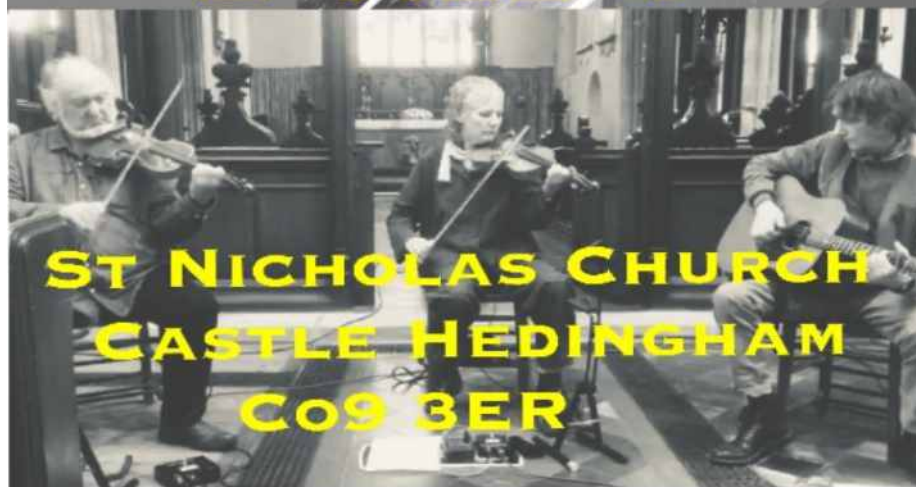

The Holy Baton Handover!

'On the day of Pentecost all the believers were meeting together in one place. Suddenly, there was a sound from heaven like the roaring of a mighty wind, and it filled the house where they were sitting. Then, what looked like flames or tongues of fire appeared and settled on each one of them. And everyone present was filled with the Holy Spirit'.

Acts Ch 2 vs 1—4a

This is the time of the year that the church celebrates the festival of Pentecost but what exactly is Pentecost?

Let's think about elite track teams and how they will spend hours practising the handover of the baton—the crucial make-or-break moment in a successful relay race.

After Jesus dies, is resurrected, spends time with the disciples, and ascends into heaven, there is a brief time when the early Christians are on their own while a holy baton handover is about to take place. On the day of Pentecost, because Jesus is no longer walking among them in the flesh to encourage and empower, God gave the Holy Spirit, another facet of the Trinity, another part of God's own self, to the people to fill them and equip them to represent God on earth—to be the church. Pentecost is often celebrated as the birthday of the church—not of any particular congregation, but as a living representation of Jesus on earth. It reminds us of the holy handover and the responsibility we now have to be the hands and feet of Jesus on earth.

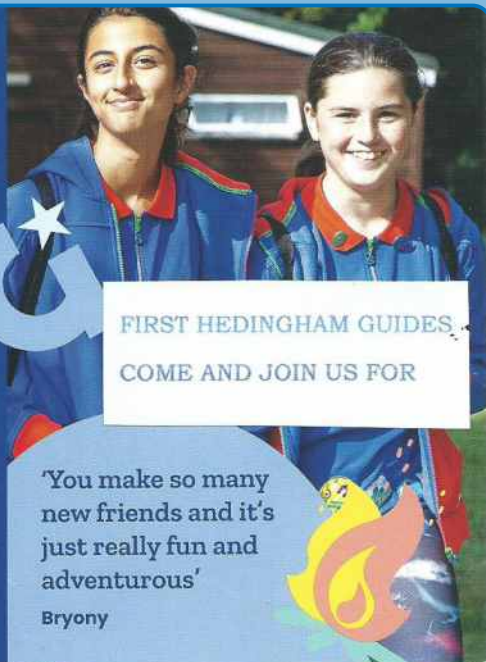

Minutes of Sible Hedingham Parish Council Annual Parish Council Meeting Held in the Village Hall on Monday 12th May 2025 at 7pm.

Present - Cllrs Adam, Beavis (Chair – re-elected), Cole, Fennelly, Heywood, Hendry, Lee, Luxon, Ranson (Vice-Chair – re-elected), Taylor, Tufnell and Young

Mrs L Slade – Clerk & 9 Members of the Public (+ 15 later)

Apologies were received and accepted from Cllrs Calver and Schwier.

All Councillors signed their acceptance as Councillor and were then elected to various Committees. Various other administrative items were agreed.

Public Comment - A resident has been advised a petition to initiate the installation of double yellow lines will need the support of the Parish Council. Cllr Beavis advised she will look at this concern and contact Cllr Schwier to establish if Essex Highways have initiated any proposals. The resident was advised this will be addressed in Agenda Item 25.

Minutes of the meeting held on 14 April 2025 - approved and signed – no matters arising.

The Parish Council wish to thank the Royal British Legion and their team, Deputy Lieutenant of Essex, residents and all stake holders for their help and support.

BALC Report - Cllr Lee reported there has been no secretary of the BALC Committee for a while but a new secretary is due to be instated. There will also be a restructuring of the EALC.

Finance – all administrative Financial matters were dealt with and agreed. Standing Orders were suspended to open the meeting up to the public to allow participation for the **Local Plan Submission**.

Residents shared their concerns about the submission of this site, comments will be added to the original Local Plan Review Comments document submitted to BDC and will be posted on the Parish Council website. **Action: Clerk to contact enforcement concerning continuation of any further works on this site.** Cllr Beavis re-entered the room to continue to Chair the meeting.

Parish Council Owned Car Park Update - One quotation has been received; two more expected. Cllr Heywood reported the parking situation has become worse. The Parish Council are investigating if more spaces can be created, however a more immediate approach to look at rules and signage for the car park will be on the agenda for the next Full Council.

Local Highways Issues and Updates

Application for double yellow lines around the junction of St. Peter's View and Alexandra Road

A resident reported an application for double yellow lines must be with the NEPP before 31 July 2025. It was also discussed to add the corner of Recreation Road to the application. **It was resolved to support an application for double yellow lines – proposed by Cllr Tufnell, seconded by Cllr Luxon, all Councillors were in agreement. Action: Clerk to investigate the next steps to enable an application.**

Update on a voluntary scheme to install roundels at each entrance to the village and two reflective bollards on the triangle at Braintree Corner - **It was resolved to submit an LHP application to install roundels at each entrance to the village and two reflective bollards on the triangle at Braintree Corner**

Cllrs Beavis and Taylor left the room.

Local Plan Submission – as previously discussed above. The call for sites is to be discussed at Braintree District Council on the 5 June 2025. Sible Hedingham Parish

Parish Council Meeting Minutes

Council objects to the Local Plan Submission – Ref: SIBH2517 – proposed by Cllr Luxon, seconded by Cllr Lee, all Councillors were in agreement. **Action: Clerk to add comments to the Local Plan Review Comments document.**

Revised Planning Application - Tanners Dairy, Prayers Hill CO9 3LE – demolition of existing buildings and construction of 44 dwelling houses, including formation of a new site access junction, estate road, public open spaces and landscaping.

This application was discussed and is smaller than the original application; it is also a brown field site so suitable for building. No objections were proposed by Cllr Ranson, seconded by Cllr Fennelly, one Cllr voted against the proposal, all other Councillors were in agreement.

To discuss and decide the Full Council Meeting Venue, Dates and Times

The Parish Council currently meet on the second Monday of each month, this was discussed and it was suggested the meetings could take place on the first Monday of each month, in order not to coincide with Castle Hedingham Parish Council Meetings. The time of the meetings will stay at 7pm. The Parish Council agreed to use the Baptist Church for regular meetings, which have fewer members of the public in attendance; for meetings where the Parish Council expect greater numbers and for the Annual Parish Meeting, the Parish Council agreed to use the Village Hall.

Resolved. Action: Clerk to enquire the cost and availability of the Baptist Church.

Clerks Report - The Clerks Report having been previously circulated to all Councillors was taken as read. Clerk also informed the meeting:

The LHP request for signage/protection Church Street – Sible Hedingham, a decision has been made by the LHP not to pursue validation.

The Structure team have advised that repair works are programmed to be undertaken on the Station Road Bridge in August this year.

A Highways Inspector is to visit Braintree road to assess the tree branches in the area and identify any necessary actions. Progress of this inspection and any steps taken can be monitored using the unique reference number 2974439 through the Track It pages on the Report It Tool.

Friends of Alderford Mill

The mill looked splendid with VE day decorations and the flag flying from the luccum, but the May open day was a disappointment with fewer visitors than expected, especially as it was National Mills weekend. This was partially due to the closure of Swan Street for road works. This highlights the benefits of our signage as many of our visitors pick up the mill opening when passing through the village. Otherwise having successfully raised the water level in the leat over the previous four days, we managed to generate enough power to run the wheel and briefly mill a coarse flour before the level dropped below that required to turn the wheel.



The Wednesday team continue to work on the steam engine drive mechanism, while others, at the request of Essex County Council have realigned and strengthened the gate post over the road from the mill to allow vehicular access on to the footpath. Over the next few weeks the other gate post will be replaced. While this work is taking place the footpath walkers must be aware that there will be a hazardous hole adjacent to the footpath until complete. Safety barriers and signs will be in place. Additionally, now we can demonstrate the chain hoist, the worn steel strips on the capstan have been replaced giving it many more years of operation. Another member of the team has completed a project to entertain young and old brains in solving a Jigsaw representation of a French Burre mill stone ready for its first public outing next month.

The wild life around the mill is slow to return since reinstating the water level following the winter drainage of the leat. The first are the ducks with three drakes regularly seen plus a small family of ducklings were spotted. Other than an occasional muntjac and coot there have been no recorded sightings of other wildlife in the vicinity of the mill.

Remember that private visits with a guided tour can be arranged subject to the mutual agreements of dates and a donation towards the maintenance the mill.

Our next open day will be on Sunday the 8th June with a games theme.

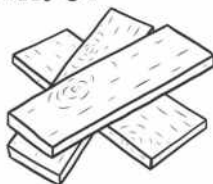

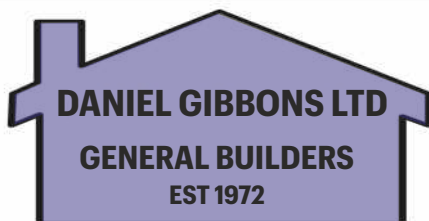
